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## THE FIRST LESSON 창세기 GENESIS 22:1-14

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1 Some time later God tested Abraham. He said to him, "Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied.

2 Then God said, "Take your son, your only son, whom you love—Isaac—and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on a mountain I will show you."

3 Early the next morning Abraham got up and loaded his donkey. He took with him two of his servants and his son Isaac. When he had cut enough wood for the burnt offering, he set out for the place God had told him about. 4 On the third day Abraham looked up and saw the place in the distance. 5 He said to his servants, "Stay here with the donkey while I and the boy go over there. We will worship and then we will come back to you."

6 Abraham took the wood for the burnt offering and placed it on his son Isaac, and he himself carried the fire and the knife. As the two of them went on together, 7 Isaac spoke up and said to his father Abraham, "Father?" "Yes, my son?" Abraham replied. "The fire and wood are here," Isaac said, "but where is the lamb for the burnt offering?"

8 Abraham answered, "God himself will provide the lamb for the burnt offering, my son." And the two of them went on together.

9 When they reached the place God had told him about, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. He bound his son Isaac and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. 10 Then he reached out his hand and took the knife to slay his son. 11 But the angel of the Lord called out to him from heaven, "Abraham! Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied.

12 "Do not lay a hand on the boy," he said. "Do not do anything to him. Now I know that you fear God, because you have not withheld from me your son, your only son."

13 Abraham looked up and there in a thicket he saw a ram[a] caught by its horns. He went over and took the ram and sacrificed it as a burnt offering instead of his son. 14 So Abraham called that place The Lord Will Provide. And to this day it is said, "On the mountain of the Lord it will be provided."

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## 시편 PSALM 13

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1 How long, Lord? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me?

2 How long must I wrestle with my thoughts and day after day have sorrow in my heart? How long will my enemy triumph over me?

3 Look on me and answer, Lord my God. Give light to my eyes, or I will sleep in death,

4 and my enemy will say, "I have overcome him," and my foes will rejoice when I fall.

5 But I trust in your unfailing love; my heart rejoices in your salvation.

6 I will sing the Lord's praise, for he has been good to me.

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## THE SECOND LESSON 로마서 ROMANS 6:12-23

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12 Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its evil desires. 13 Do not offer any part of yourself to sin as an instrument of wickedness, but rather offer yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life; and offer every part of yourself to him as an instrument of righteousness. 14 For sin shall no longer be your master, because you are not under the law, but under grace.

15 What then? Shall we sin because we are not under the law but under grace? By no means! 16 Don't you know that when you offer yourselves to someone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one you obey—whether you are slaves to sin, which leads to death, or to obedience, which leads to righteousness? 17 But thanks be to God that, though you used to be slaves to sin, you have come to obey from your heart the pattern of teaching that has now claimed your allegiance. 18 You have been set free from sin and have become slaves to righteousness.

19 I am using an example from everyday life because of your human limitations. Just as you used to offer yourselves as slaves to impurity and to ever-increasing wickedness, so now offer yourselves as slaves to righteousness leading to holiness. 20 When you were slaves to sin, you were free from the control of righteousness. 21 What benefit did you reap at that time from the things you are now ashamed of? Those things result in death! 22 But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the benefit you reap leads to holiness, and the result is eternal life. 23 For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

### Exploring the Text Together

The passage from Romans 6:12-23 is a central part of the Apostle Paul's letter to the Roman church. Paul declares that because we have died and risen with Jesus Christ, we have been rescued from the power of sin and placed under God's grace. This text clearly explains our change in status: we are no longer slaves bound to obey sin, but servants of righteousness dedicated to God.

The believers in Rome faced the dangerous misconception that they could keep sinning so that grace might increase. Paul counteracts this by reminding them that through our union with Christ in baptism, our old sinful nature was put to death. Therefore, with the help of the Holy Spirit, we must stop offering our bodies to sin and instead present ourselves to God as instruments for His holy purposes.

In conclusion, Paul contrasts two ways of living and their final outcomes, urging a solemn choice. The endpoint of being a slave to sin is eternal death, but the fruit of being a servant of God is holiness, leading to eternal life. For us today, this Scripture is a powerful reminder from the Holy Spirit to evaluate who rules our daily lives and to whom we offer our obedience.

## Themes of Faith Found in the Passage

The first major theological theme in this text is the change of ownership and obedience. Scripture teaches that there is no neutral ground in human existence. A person is either ruled by sin or serves as a follower of God. The Holy Spirit opens our eyes to see that we have been set free from our miserable slavery to sin, and are now called to willingly obey God's righteous word.

The second theme is the daily choice to offer our bodies to God. Paul emphasizes that we must not yield our body parts—our hands, feet, eyes, and speech—to sin as tools for doing wrong. Instead, we are to present them to God as instruments of righteousness. This shows that saving faith is not just head knowledge; it is a practical life of worship where we use our physical actions to do good under the Holy Spirit's guidance.

The third theme is the sharp contrast between the wages of sin and the gift of God. The payment that sin earns is ultimate ruin and spiritual death. In contrast, the completely free gift that God gives in Christ Jesus is eternal life. This eternal life is not something we earn by our own strength, but a gift of pure grace that bears fruit in a holy and devoted life.

## Reflecting on Our Lives and Faith

Modern society promises us absolute freedom, but it often ends up making us captives to selfish desires, anxiety, and worldly traps. As we grow older and gain more life experience, we deeply realize that we cannot overcome sinful habits or internal worries relying solely on our own strength. Through this text, the Holy Spirit prompts us to examine our hearts and see what is truly ruling our thoughts and actions today.

Even though we believe in Jesus and have experienced the grace of baptism, we must honestly reflect on whether we still allow our bodies to practice old habits like complaining, jealousy, or resentment. Holiness is not achieved overnight; it begins with a small daily decision each morning to say, "Not my will, but Yours be done, Lord." The Holy Spirit knows our limitations and provides the strength to stand up again as righteous instruments.

For believers walking through the later chapters of life, this passage provides the key to making our remaining years truly meaningful. Instead of wasting our energy on empty pursuits that lead to spiritual emptiness, we are called to be bound by Christ's love to serve our neighbors and the church. May you hold firmly to the hope of eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord, experiencing genuine peace and freedom under God's grace every single day.

## Questions for Shared Reflection

1. What was a worldly habit or temptation that you found difficult to break in the past, and how did you experience change through faith in Jesus and the help of the Holy Spirit?
2. Paul tells us to offer our body parts to God as "instruments of righteousness." In what practical ways can you use your hands, feet, or speech as good tools for God this coming week?
3. As you look back over the many seasons of your life, how does the truth that "the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life" speak to your heart today?

## Action Plan

1. Monday: Offering Our Speech: Avoid all complaining or harsh words today. Intentionally speak words of encouragement and gratitude inspired by the Holy Spirit.
2. Tuesday: Guarding Our Eyes: Turn away from worldly or judgmental views. Focus on God's goodness by reading three additional Bible verses today.
3. Wednesday: Hands and Feet of Service: Reach out to a family member or neighbor in need. Perform a small act of kindness or make a caring phone call to use your body for good.
4. Thursday: Surrendering the Heart: When anxiety or resentment tries to take over, declare aloud three times: "I am a servant of God," and surrender your heart to the Holy Spirit.
5. Friday: A Worship of Gratitude: Reflect on the free gift of eternal life. Spend quiet time singing a hymn or writing down five specific things you are grateful for.

## Prayer

Loving and gracious Heavenly Father, we thank You for Your immense grace in rescuing us from the miserable bondage of sin through the precious blood of Your Son, Jesus Christ, and making us Your children and servants of righteousness. May we remember daily that through baptism our old selves have died with Christ. By the power of the Holy Spirit, help us offer our bodies completely as holy and good instruments that bring joy to You. Keep our hearts from being carried away by the temporary temptations and anxieties of this world. Let us live our remaining years in joyful obedience, holding fast to the hope of eternal life given freely by You. In the name of Jesus Christ, our Savior, we pray. Amen.

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## THE GOSPEL 마태복음 MATTHEW 10:40-42

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40 “Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me, and anyone who welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. 41 Whoever welcomes a prophet as a prophet will receive a prophet’s reward, and whoever welcomes a righteous person as a righteous person will receive a righteous person’s reward. 42 And if anyone gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones who is my disciple, truly I tell you, that person will certainly not lose their reward.”
