THE FIRST LESSON 창세기 GENESIS 29:15-28

15 Laban said to him, “Just because you are a relative of mine, should you work for me for nothing? Tell me what your wages should be.”

16 Now Laban had two daughters; the name of the older was Leah, and the name of the younger was Rachel. 17 Leah had weak eyes, but Rachel had a lovely figure and was beautiful. 18 Jacob was in love with Rachel and said, “I’ll work for you seven years in return for your younger daughter Rachel.”

19 Laban said, “It’s better that I give her to you than to some other man. Stay here with me.” 20 So Jacob served seven years to get Rachel, but they seemed like only a few days to him because of his love for her.

21 Then Jacob said to Laban, “Give me my wife. My time is completed, and I want to make love to her.”

22 So Laban brought together all the people of the place and gave a feast. 23 But when evening came, he took his daughter Leah and brought her to Jacob, and Jacob made love to her. 24 And Laban gave his servant Zilpah to his daughter as her attendant.

25 When morning came, there was Leah! So Jacob said to Laban, “What is this you have done to me? I served you for Rachel, didn’t I? Why have you deceived me?”

26 Laban replied, “It is not our custom here to give the younger daughter in marriage before the older one. 27 Finish this daughter’s bridal week; then we will give you the younger one also, in return for another seven years of work.”

28 And Jacob did so. He finished the week with Leah, and then Laban gave him his daughter Rachel to be his wife.

시편 PSALM 105:1-11, 45B

1 Give praise to the Lord, proclaim his name; make known among the nations what he has done.

2 Sing to him, sing praise to him; tell of all his wonderful acts.

3 Glory in his holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice.

4 Look to the Lord and his strength; seek his face always.

5 Remember the wonders he has done, his miracles, and the judgments he pronounced,

6 you his servants, the descendants of Abraham, his chosen ones, the children of Jacob.

7 He is the Lord our God; his judgments are in all the earth.

8 He remembers his covenant forever, the promise he made, for a thousand generations,

9 the covenant he made with Abraham, the oath he swore to Isaac.

10 He confirmed it to Jacob as a decree, to Israel as an everlasting covenant:

11 “To you I will give the land of Canaan as the portion you will inherit.”

THE SECOND LESSON 로마서 ROMANS 8:26–39

26 In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans. 27 And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for God’s people in accordance with the will of God.

28 And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who[a] have been called according to his purpose. 29 For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters. 30 And those he predestined, he also called; those he called, he also justified; those he justified, he also glorified.

31 What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? 32 He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? 33 Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. 34 Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. 35 Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? 36 As it is written: “For your sake we face death all day long; we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered.”

37 No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. 38 For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, 39 neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Exploring the Text Together

Romans 8 is one of Paul's clearest and most encouraging chapters about the Christian life. Verses 26–39 begin with the Holy Spirit helping believers in their weakness and conclude with the triumphant assurance that nothing can separate us from God's love in Christ. The passage moves from human weakness to divine victory.

Paul wrote to Christians in Rome who lived with uncertainty, suffering, and growing opposition. Rather than promising an easy life, Paul reminds them that God is actively working through every circumstance. Their confidence rests not in changing circumstances but in God's unchanging character.

Theologically, this passage highlights the work of the Holy Spirit, the sovereignty of God, and the certainty of salvation through Christ. Our security is rooted in God's grace rather than our own strength. Therefore, believers can live with hope even in seasons of hardship.

Themes of Faith Found in the Passage

1. The Holy Spirit Helps Our Weakness

There are times when we do not know how to pray. The Holy Spirit understands our deepest needs and intercedes according to God's will. Our confidence comes from God's faithfulness rather than our perfect prayers.

2. God Works Through Every Circumstance

Romans 8:28 does not teach that every event is good by itself. Instead, it promises that God is able to work even painful experiences into His good purposes. Believers are invited to trust God's wisdom when they cannot yet see the outcome.

3. God's Love Is Unbreakable

The closing verses declare one of Scripture's strongest assurances. Suffering, persecution, hardship, or even death cannot separate believers from God's love in Christ. Our security rests in God's grip on us, not merely our grip on Him.

Reflecting on Our Lives and Faith

There are seasons when prayer feels difficult. During those moments, we may wonder whether God hears us. This passage reminds us that the Holy Spirit is already interceding for us, even when words fail.

Life often includes experiences we cannot understand. God's purposes may not be visible in the moment. Yet over time, many believers discover that He has been shaping their character and strengthening their faith.

Finally, this passage calls us to live with confidence rather than fear. Neither our failures nor the hardships of life are greater than God's love. Because of that assurance, we can trust Him and extend His love to others.

Questions for Shared Reflection

1. When have you most clearly experienced the Holy Spirit's help in prayer?
2. Can you share a time when God brought good out of a difficult situation?
3. How does the promise that nothing can separate us from God's love shape the way you face today's challenges?

Meditation & Prayer

NIV: "Nothing... will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:39, excerpt)

Read these words slowly and remember that God's love remains constant even when circumstances change.

Heavenly Father, thank You for knowing our weakness and for giving us the Holy Spirit to help us. Teach us to trust You when life is difficult, believing that You are working for Your good purposes. Fill our hearts with the confidence that nothing can separate us from Your love in Christ, and help us share that love with those around us. In the name of Jesus Christ, Amen.

HE GOSPEL 마태복음 MATTHEW 13:31-33, 44-52

31 He told them another parable: “The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. 32 Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches.”

33 He told them still another parable: “The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed into about sixty pounds of flour until it worked all through the dough.”

44 “The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field.

45 “Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. 46 When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it.

47 “Once again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was let down into the lake and caught all kinds of fish. 48 When it was full, the fishermen pulled it up on the shore. Then they sat down and collected the good fish in baskets, but threw the bad away. 49 This is how it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come and separate the wicked from the righteous 50 and throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

51 “Have you understood all these things?” Jesus asked. “Yes,” they replied.

52 He said to them, “Therefore every teacher of the law who has become a disciple in the kingdom of heaven is like the owner of a house who brings out of his storeroom new treasures as well as old.”
