THE FIRST LESSON 출애굽기 EXODUS 17:1-7

1 The whole Israelite community set out from the Desert of Sin, traveling from place to place as the Lord commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. 2 So they quarreled with Moses and said, "Give us water to drink."

Moses replied, "Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you put the Lord to the test?"

3 But the people were thirsty for water there, and they grumbled against Moses. They said, "Why did you bring us up out of Egypt to make us and our children and livestock die of thirst?"

4 Then Moses cried out to the Lord, "What am I to do with these people? They are almost ready to stone me."

5 The Lord answered Moses, "Go out in front of the people. Take with you some of the elders of Israel and take in your hand the staff with which you struck the Nile, and go. 6 I will stand there before you by the rock at Horeb. Strike the rock, and water will come out of it for the people to drink." So Moses did this in the sight of the elders of Israel. 7 And he called the place Massah and Meribah because the Israelites quarreled and because they tested the Lord saying, "Is the Lord among us or not?"

시편 PSALM 78:1-4, 12-16

1 My people, hear my teaching; listen to the words of my mouth.

2 I will open my mouth with a parable; I will utter hidden things, things from of old—

3 things we have heard and known, things our ancestors have told us.

4 We will not hide them from their descendants; we will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord, his power, and the wonders he has done.

12 He did miracles in the sight of their ancestors in the land of Egypt, in the region of Zoan.

13 He divided the sea and led them through; he made the water stand up like a wall.

14 He guided them with the cloud by day and with light from the fire all night.

15 He split the rocks in the wilderness and gave them water as abundant as the seas;

16 he brought streams out of a rocky crag and made water flow down like rivers.

THE SECOND LESSON 빌립보서 PHILIPPIANS 2:1-13

2 Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, 2 then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. 3 Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, 4 not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.

5 In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:

6 Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage;

7 rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.

8 And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death—even death on a cross!

9 Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name,

10 that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth,

11 and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

12 Therefore, my dear friends, as you have always obeyed—not only in my presence, but now much more in my absence—continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling, 13 for it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose.

1. Text Overview

Paul wrote this letter from prison to the church in Philippi, a congregation he dearly loved. They had supported him and brought him great joy, yet they also faced pressure from outside and tension among members (4:2).

Chapter 2 opens with a heartfelt appeal. If they have known comfort, love, and the fellowship of the Spirit in Christ, Paul urges them to be "like-minded, having the same love" (v. 2).

Paul then tells the story of Christ, who emptied and humbled himself and was then exalted by God (vv. 6–11). On that foundation, he calls believers to obey and to work out their salvation (vv. 12–13).

2. Key Themes

Unity through humility. Paul writes, "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves" (v. 3). Humility is not thinking poorly of ourselves; it is noticing the needs of others first. A church becomes one not when everyone agrees, but when everyone cares for one another.

The mind of Christ. Though Jesus was equal with God, "he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant" (v. 7). He was obedient even to death on a cross (v. 8). Paul calls us to share this same mindset (v. 5).

Salvation God brings to completion. Paul urges, "continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling" (v. 12). This does not mean earning salvation by our own effort. Because "it is God who works in you to will and to act" (v. 13), we can walk the road of obedience with confidence.

3. Reflection

As we grow older, we lean on our experience and familiar ways. That can make it easy to close our hearts when others see things differently. The mind of Christ moves us to understand another person's situation before proving we are right. This week, listen fully to someone whose view differs from yours.

To "empty ourselves" means letting go of our position and our wish to be recognized. It can begin by gladly taking on unseen tasks at church or at home. When we serve without praise, we grow more like our Lord. Practice one quiet act of service this week.

When faith feels hard, we easily lose heart and think, "I'm just not enough." Yet the Holy Spirit is at work within us even now. Our obedience flows not from anxiety but from trust in God. Begin each morning by entrusting your day to Him in prayer.

4. Discussion Questions

1. Share a recent time when you looked to "the interests of others" rather than your own—or a time when you found that hard.
2. What might you need to let go of in order to follow Christ's example of humility?

5. Meditation & Prayer

Loving God, we praise You for Jesus Christ, who emptied Himself and humbled Himself even to the cross for our sake. Fill us with His mind, and teach us to serve one another in humility rather than rivalry or pride. Help us rely on Your Spirit at work within us, that we may obey You day by day. In the name of Jesus Christ we pray. Amen.

THE GOSPEL 마태복음 MATTHEW 21:23-32

23 Jesus entered the temple courts, and, while he was teaching, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him. “By what authority are you doing these things?” they asked. “And who gave you this authority?”

24 Jesus replied, “I will also ask you one question. If you answer me, I will tell you by what authority I am doing these things. 25 John’s baptism—where did it come from? Was it from heaven, or of human origin?”

They discussed it among themselves and said, “If we say, ‘From heaven,’ he will ask, ‘Then why didn’t you believe him?’ 26 But if we say, ‘Of human origin’—we are afraid of the people, for they all hold that John was a prophet.”

27 So they answered Jesus, “We don’t know.”

Then he said, “Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things.

28 “What do you think? There was a man who had two sons. He went to the first and said, ‘Son, go and work today in the vineyard.’

29 “‘I will not,’ he answered, but later he changed his mind and went.

30 “Then the father went to the other son and said the same thing. He answered, ‘I will, sir,’ but he did not go.

31 “Which of the two did what his father wanted?”

“The first,” they answered.

Jesus said to them, “Truly I tell you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God ahead of you. 32 For John came to you to show you the way of righteousness, and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the prostitutes did. And even after you saw this, you did not repent and believe him.
